<p>continent - the world is made up of 7 continents</p> <p>compare - note the similarities or differences between two things</p> <p>landmark - a feature of a landscape or town that is easily seen and recognised</p> <p>population - all the people that live in a place</p> <p>states - a nation or place organised under one government</p> <p>border - a line separating two countries</p> <p>body of water - such as a lake, ocean or river</p> <p>weather - the weather at a given time, hot, sunny, windy etc</p> <p>climate - the weather conditions seen in an area over a long period of time</p> <p>proximity - nearness</p> <p>equator - an imaginary line drawn around the earth dividing the earth into the northern and southern hemispheres. The nearer to the equator a country is then the hotter it is.</p> <p>temperature - heat present in something</p> <p>physical geography- natural features such as rivers, mountains and forests</p> <p>human geography- man made features such as buildings, shops and roads</p> <p>tropical rainforest- a tropical woodland with a lot of rain. It has no dry season.</p>

<p>Mexico, officially the United Mexican States, is a country in the southern portion of North America. It is bordered to the north by the United States; to the south and west by the Pacific Ocean; to the southeast by Guatemala, Belize, and the Caribbean Sea; and to the east by the Gulf of Mexico</p>
