Background knowledge

Oscar-Claude Monet (14 November 1840 – 5 December 1926) was a French painter, a founder of French <u>Impressionist</u> painting and the most consistent and prolific practitioner of the movement's philosophy of expressing one's perceptions before nature.

Monet's ambition of documenting the French countryside led him to adopt a method of painting the same scene many times in order to capture the changing of light and the passing of the seasons.

What should I already know?
