Personal, Social and Emotional Development Interested in others play and stating to join in Expresses own preferences and interests Shows understanding and cooperates with some boundaries and routines

Communication, Language and Literacy

Shows interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes. Learns new words very rapidly and is able to use them in communicating

Listen to stories with increased attention and recall Understands use of objects

Can retell a simple past event in order

Questions why things happen and give explanations Builds up vocabulary based on breadth of experiences

Maintains attention, concentrates and sits quietly during appropriate activity (continued)

Listens and responds to ideas expressed by others in conversation and discussion

Extends vocabulary by grouping, naming and exploring the meanings of new words.

Physical Development

Begin to be independent in self-care but still often needs adult support

Shows control in using mark making tools

Observes the effects of activity on their bodies

Understands that equipment and tools have to be used safely Can catch a large ball

Can copy some letters e.g. letters from their name

Shows understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges and considers and manages some risks

Eats healthy food stuff and understands the need for variety in food

Handles tools with safety and with increased control Begins to form recognisable letters

Shows increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking.

Literacy

Fills in the missing word or phrase in a known rhyme, or story Sometimes gives meaning to marks as they draw and paint Shows awareness of rhyme and alliteration Enjoys rhyming and rhythmic activities

Looks at books independently

Handles books carefully

Continues a rhyming string

Hears and says the initial sounds in words

Link sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet

Can segment and blend sounds in simple words Knows that information can be retrieved from books Use some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning

Mathematics

Begin to categorise objects according to properties such as shape or size and begin to use the language of size Selects a small number of objects from a group Begin to make comparisons between quantities Use some language of quantities such as more and a lot Begin to talk about the shapes of everyday objects Uses some number names and number language spontaneously Uses some number names accurately in play Order two or three items by length or height Begin to use everyday language related to money Begin to use mathematical names for 2d and 3d shapes Selects the correct numeral to represent 1-5 Estimates how many objects and check by counting Finds the total number in two groups by counting all of them and use the language of adding.

In pretend play, imitates everyday actions and events from own family and cultural background

Enjoys playing with small world toys i.e. farm

Notices detailed features of objects in their environment Shows interest in different occupations and ways of life

Comments and asks questions about the natural world Can talk about some things they have observed

Developing an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time.

Enjoys joining in with family customs and routines Looks closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change (seasonal)

Interacts with age appropriate software

Expressive Art and Design

Shows an interest in the way musical instruments sound Experiments with blocks, colours and marks

Joins in singing favourite songs

Enjoys joining in with dancing and ring games

Sings a few familiar songs

Explores and learns how sounds can be changed

Explores and learns how colours can be changed

Begin to construct, making enclosures and creating spaces

Understand that different media can be combined to create new

Builds up a repertoire of songs and dances
