Kandinsky was born in Moscow in 1866. Before devoting himself completely to art, he studied law at Moscow state university. At the age of 30 he decided he would focus solely on painting. Kandinsky believed that art was closely connected to music. He also believed that geometric forms, lines, and colours could express the inner life of the artist.
