Andy Goldsworthy (born 26 July 1956) is a British sculptor, photographer and environmentalist who produces site-specific sculptures and land art situated in natural and urban settings. He lives and works in Scotland. The materials used in Andy Goldsworthy's art often included brightly coloured flowers, leaves, mud, pinecones, snow, stone, twigs and thorns.
