Dear Families,

Welcome to the new academic year! The children have arrived in school full of energy and enthusiasm after their summer holiday. It has been wonderful to see them enjoying their learning, being with their friends, and getting into their school routine, all with such huge smiles on their faces. There are no doubt some rather tired children coming home tonight after such a busy week, so plenty of rest and cuddles may be needed this weekend, as they have all done brilliantly well and given 100% effort all week.

Uniform

Thank you for making sure that the children have the correct uniform and PE kit in school. I know this can be expensive, and the labelling with names can take a little time, but the children learn best when they feel confident, smart and take a sense of take pride in their appearance. On Monday we had our first whole school assembly (for Year 1 to 4) since before the lockdowns, and the children loved being together to share such special collective reflection time as a community.

School grounds

As you will have seen, we had some fencing installed on the school field during the holidays, with steps leading the children safely on and off the field. We are still unable to use the trim trail unfortunately, due to some excess cracking of the wood in parts, and we are in talks with Northumberland Council to find a way forward with this. In the meantime, please do not allow the children to play on it before or after school please, as we are not allowed to use it for health and safety reasons.

Over the next week we will be getting some rather wonderful playground markings done to enhance the opportunities for outdoor play. We are also having some done on our rooftop, which is coming together very nicely as a sensory and interactive learning space.

Information over coffee drop ins

The staff from each year group will be running an informal coffee session for parents and carers to come along to find out more information about how learning in their new class is organised and the experiences the children will get. This is also an opportunity for you to meet your child's teacher, find out how to support your child at home, and ask any general questions.
