Background knowledge

Georges-Pierre Seurat (2 December 1859 – 29 March 1891) was a French post-Impressionist artist. He is best known for devising the painting techniques known as chromoluminarism as well as pointillism. His large-scale work altered the direction of modern art by initiating Neo-impressionism, and is one of the icons of late 19th-century painting.

<p>Primary Colour – Red, yellow and blue. You can't make these colours out of any other colours.</p> <p>Secondary colours – Purple, orange and green. Made by mixing primary colours together.</p> <p>Tertiary colours – Colours made by mixing a primary and secondary colour</p> <p>Explore – to investigate.</p> <p>Pointillism – A technique of painting when small dots of colour are applied in patterns to form an image.</p> <p>Shade – making a colour darker or lighter.</p> <p>Tools – The equipment used to do a particular job.</p> <p>Technique – Ways of carrying out a particular task.</p>
