

## General Information

1.	Many of Jesus' parables refer to simple everyday things, such as a woman baking bread, a man knocking on his neighbour's door but they deal with major religious themes, such as the growth of the Kingdom of God, the importance of prayer, and the meaning of love.
2.	Christian symbols are used to honour beliefs of the faith. Three important symbols are the cross, fish, and the Greek letters alpha and omega.
3.	Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He came to earth to teach about love and fellowship. He represents the person that all Christians must strive to be. Jesus was a Jew who was born about 2000 years ago in Bethlehem.
4.	In the Christian religion, the Trinity is an idea used to explain that three different persons are called God: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Trinity states that these three all form the same God.

Learn about stories told by Jesus about the character of God.

Understand that Christians form communities. Know that Christian teachings affect personal and social matters.

Christians believe that God as the Holy Spirit is present in people's lives.

Learn about saints, saintliness and sainthood.
