

Key Vocabulary			
1	Molars	Teeth that are used for grinding and mushing.	
2	Canines	Teeth that are used for holding prey and for cutting into meat.	
3	Incisors	Teeth that are used for snipping and nibbling.	
4	Herbivore	An organism that only eats plants.	
5	Carnivore	An animal that only eats meat.	
6	Omnivore	An animal that eats both plants and meat.	
7	Predator	An animal that naturally preys on others (that eats other animals)	
8	Prey	An animal that is hunted and killed by another for food	
9	Producer	Is an organism, either a green plant or bacterium, which is part of the first level of a food chain.	
10	Food chain/Web	a series of organisms each dependent on the next as a source of food.
